Business Statesmanship Award

The Business Statesmanship Award was established in honor of Peter G. Peterson, CED's longest serving Trustee. It recognizes corporate executives who champion issues in the interest of the public good, and who hold themselves to the highest standards of ethics and integrity.



Mark T. Bertolini
Chairman and CEO, **Aetna**

Mark T. Bertolini is Chairman and CEO of Aetna, a Fortune 50 diversified healthcare benefits company with over \$63 billion in 2016 revenue. Mr. Bertolini assumed the role of CEO in November 2010 and of Chairman in April 2011. Mr. Bertolini joined Aetna in 2003 as head of Aetna's Specialty Products. From July 2007 to December 2014, he served as President, responsible for all of Aetna's businesses and operations across the company's broad range of healthcare products and related services.

In 2016, Mr. Bertolini was recognized in the top four of *Modern Healthcare's* 100 Most Influential People in Healthcare for his efforts to promote measures that increase access, lower costs, and improve quality. He meets regularly with state and federal policymakers to further these efforts and share Aetna's vision for a consumer-centric healthcare system. Mr. Bertolini has also been recognized as a leader in corporate social responsibility for his historic decision to raise Aetna's base wage to \$16 per hour and reduce out-of-pocket medical expenses for low-income households. In recognition of this decision, he was named in *Fortune's* 2015 list of the World's 50 Greatest Leaders and the 2015 *Politico* 50.

President and CEO, **Guardian**

Deanna M. Mulligan is President and CEO and on the Board of Directors for The Guardian Life Insurance Company of America. Under her leadership, Guardian has achieved record earnings, diversified outside the U.S., and grown its customer base from 5 to 26 million people. Ms. Mulligan was also President and Chief Operating Officer and head of Individual Life & Disability.

Previously, Ms. Mulligan co-led the North American Life Insurance policy at McKinsey and Company. She also held senior positions at AXA Financial, New York Life Insurance Company, and ChannelPoint.

With a strong focus on workforce and economic development, Ms. Mulligan regularly meets with policymakers. She served on President Obama's Advisory Council on Financial Capability for Young Americans. She is part of the Stanford Graduate School of Business Advisory Council, and holds board positions at the Partnership for New York City, the Economic Club of New York, and the Committee Encouraging Corporate Philanthropy (CECP). She recently chaired the Board of the American Council of Life Insurers.

Fortune has named Ms. Mulligan one of the "50 Most Powerful Women in Business" and *Crain's New York Business* named her among "The 50 Most Powerful Women in New York."

Ronald P. O'Hanley

President and CEO, **State Street Global Advisors**

Vice Chairman, **State Street Corporation**

Ronald P. O'Hanley is President and CEO of State Street Global Advisors (SSGA), the investment management arm of State Street Corporation. He is also Vice Chairman of State Street Corporation, a member of the Management Committee, the company's senior strategy and policymaking team, and leads the firm's Corporate Strategy function.

Prior to his role at SSGA, Mr. O'Hanley was President of Asset Management & Corporate Services for Fidelity Investments. Mr. O'Hanley also served as President and CEO of BNY Mellon Asset Management in Boston as well as Vice Chairman of Bank of New York Mellon Corporation, and was a Partner at McKinsey & Company, where he founded the Investment Management practice worldwide and was co-founder and co-leader of the firm's North American Personal Financial Services practice.

Mr. O'Hanley is a member of the boards of Unum and Rhode Island Commerce Corporation. He serves as Vice Chairman of Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center Board of Directors. He also serves on numerous non-profit boards including The Boston Foundation, The Conference Board, and the EastWest Institute.

Sandra E. Peterson

Group Worldwide Chairman, **Johnson & Johnson**

Sandra E. Peterson is playing a transformational role at Johnson & Johnson—a company with one of the world’s 10 largest market capitalizations and the largest company in healthcare. Sandi oversees the Consumer, Consumer Medical Device, and Medical Device businesses, which generate nearly \$40 billion, more than half of J&J’s total revenue.

Her portfolio includes such iconic brands as Johnson’s Baby, BAND-AID, Tylenol, Neutrogena, Aveeno and ACUVUE, as well as surgical, orthopedics, and interventional solutions vital to healthcare systems and providers worldwide. Also responsible for J&J’s global supply chain and technology infrastructure, Sandi is driving the company-wide use of technology and design to create breakthrough solutions and new business models that will radically improve healthcare.

Before joining J&J, Sandi was CEO of Bayer Crop Science AG. She is a member of the Microsoft Board of Directors, and a former board member of Dun & Bradstreet. Sandi is a founding member of Women Corporate Directors, and is a member of Women’s Forum and C200. She serves on the Rutberg & Company Wireless Influencers Board of Advisors, and the International Advisory Board of the Center for the Advanced Study of India at the University of Pennsylvania. Sandi is also a member of the Board of Trustees at the Institute for Advanced Study, one of the world’s leading centers for theoretical research and intellectual inquiry. She was also Chairman of the Board of EcoHealth Alliance. Sandi has been named to *Fortune*’s list of “The Most Powerful Women” multiple times.



Owen B. Butler Education Excellence Award

The Owen B. Butler Education Excellence Award was established in 2013 in honor of Brad Butler, former Chairman and CEO of Procter & Gamble, and former Chairman of CED. The Award recognizes an individual's exceptional commitment to quality education, skills development, and workforce development programs.



Mike Petters

President and CEO, **Huntington Ingalls Industries**

Mike Petters is President and CEO of Huntington Ingalls Industries, America's largest military shipbuilding company and a provider of professional services to partners in government and industry. He is also a member of HII's board of directors. Petters previously served as President of Northrop Grumman Shipbuilding and as President of Northrop Grumman's Newport News sector.

A native of Florida, Petters earned a bachelor's degree in physics from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1982, served aboard the nuclear-powered submarine USS George Bancroft (SSBN 643), and spent five years in the U.S. Naval Reserve. In 1993, he earned an MBA from the College of William and Mary.

Petters is Chairman of the Virginia Business Council, a member of the Aerospace Industries Association's executive committee, and a member of the Commonwealth of Virginia's Advisory Council on Revenue Estimates. He serves on the board of directors for the U.S. Naval Academy Foundation, the National Bureau of Asian Research, and the Virginia Foundation for Community College Education. He also serves on the board of advisors for the Center for a New American Security, the board of trustees of the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation, and the distinguished advisory board for the Dolphin Scholarship Foundation.

The Leadership in Diversity Award was established by CED to honor exceptional companies and individuals who are leading programs that foster diversity in the workplace and that champion underrepresented groups.



Arne M. Sorenson

President and CEO, **Marriott International**

Arne M. Sorenson is President and CEO of Marriott International, the largest lodging company in the world.

Mr. Sorenson joined Marriott in 1996. He became the third CEO in the company's history in 2012 — and the first without the Marriott surname. Prior to that, he served as Marriott's President and Chief Operating Officer. He has held a number of positions, including Executive Vice President, Chief Financial Officer, and President of Continental European Lodging. He was elected to Marriott's Board of Directors in 2011.

Mr. Sorenson chairs Marriott's Global Diversity and Inclusion Council. The Council, along with the Marriott Board of Directors' Committee for Excellence, monitors and evaluates Marriott's strategy to promote a diverse workforce, as well as ownership, customer, and vendor communities around the world.

Before he joined Marriott, Mr. Sorenson was a partner with the law firm Latham & Watkins in Washington, D.C., where he specialized in mergers and acquisitions litigation.

He is a graduate of Luther College in Decorah, Iowa and the University of Minnesota Law School. He and his wife Ruth live in the Washington, D.C. area, where they raised their four children.

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
